



**Resolution by the Oregon Republican Party  
Honoring the life and leadership of Audrey McCall**

WHEREAS, Audrey McCall, was born on February 26, 1915, in Spokane, Wash., and passed away on November 15, 2007; and

WHEREAS, Audrey McCall, the wife of Oregon Governor Tom McCall, was the state's first lady from 1967 to 1975, a time when Oregon became famous for leading the country in social and environmental innovations; and

WHEREAS, Audrey McCall was known as a political force, dedicating much of her time and fundraising skills in a bipartisan manner to candidates and causes that were important to her; and

WHEREAS, Audrey McCall worked through the end of her life to carry on her late husband's legacy of protecting strict statewide land-use laws; and

WHEREAS, Audrey McCall believed in the core values of the Republican Party; and

WHEREAS, Audrey McCall was known as a dedicated public servant, wife, and mother; and

WHEREAS, Audrey McCall's work had a positive impact on the lives of those with whom she came in contact; and

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Oregon Republican Party honors the life and accomplishments of Audrey McCall for her years of public service to the Republican Party and the State of Oregon.
