

Electronic Petitions

Procedures For “E-Petitions”

- Only the “E-Petition” certified by the Secretary of State for circulation will be accepted
- When sending an “E-Petition” by electronic mail, the text of the measure must be included with the message.
- It is best to send the “E-Petition” and the text of the measure as attachments to your message.
- Only one elector can sign the “E-Petition”.
- The only person who can sign the “E-Petition” is the person who actually clicked “print” to cause the petition sheet to be printed.
- “E-Petitions” can only be printed on white paper.
- “E-Petitions” cannot be circulated.
- “E-Petitions” must be returned to the chief petitioner(s) or a designated agent of the chief petitioner(s).
- When posting an “E-Petition” on a website, make sure the text of the measure is also posted on the website.
- It is illegal to offer anything of value in exchange for signing an “E-Petition”.
